### Notes

- 1. This is a summary financial report for the year 2019. It does not include some of the organisational and legal details normally provided on a full annual report.
- 2. Restricted funds are those set aside or donated for a specific purpose.
- 3. Although a comparison with the previous year is interesting, it does not always give a full or accurate picture due to:
- differences in accounting practice
- changed priorities and demands
- variations at year end (such as outstanding amounts or accruals)
- 4. Gift aid recovered was slightly late (January 2020) and this explains the lower amount in the 2019 income figures.
- 5. The increased expenditure on church fabric and furnishings was largely due to the refurbishment of the church office and the installation of new lighting.

#### **CURRENT FINANCIAL SITUATION**

Although the above financial summary report relates to the calendar year 2019, the delay of the APCM means that it does not represent the current state of the church finances. The following brief notes may answer some questions that might be raised at the APCM.

The coronavirus situation has had an impact on church finances. During the early part of the year, giving reduced as it was not possible for people to use the envelope schemes or loose plate giving. This situation appears to have improved, possibly from givers opting for direct debit.

Our administrator was furloughed from April and returned to work during August. Although salary costs were incurred during the first quarter of the year, the government job retention scheme significantly helped from April onwards. It was not possible to furlough our administrative assistant.

The current balance (in the general and deposit accounts together) amounts to £38616, of which £3087 is set aside for specific purposes. This balance is slightly less than the charity commission recommendation. However, it is higher than balances earlier in the year.
